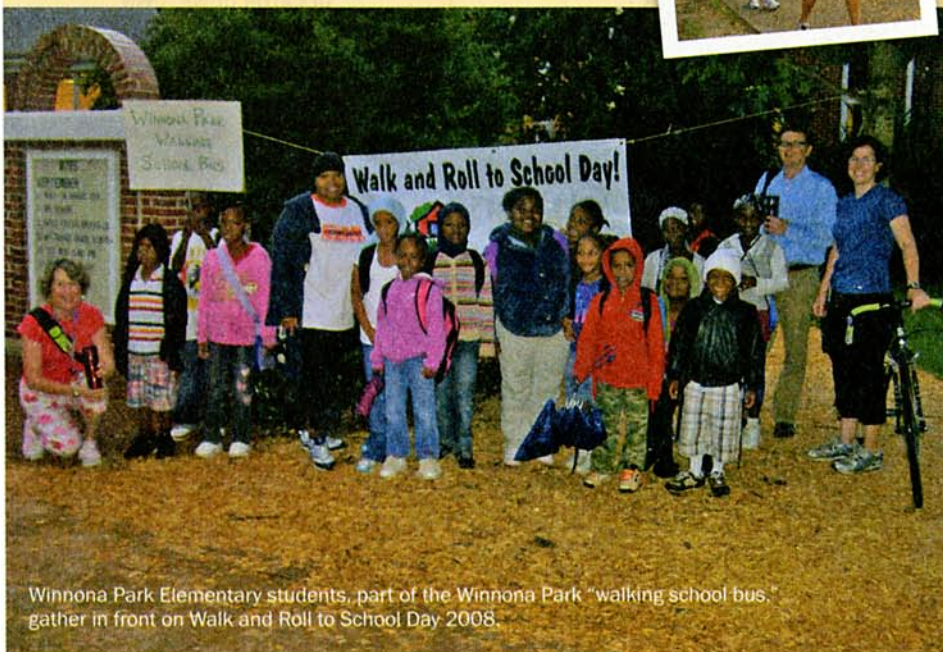
Safe Routes to School Events

Leadership DeKalb Honors Outstanding Alumni

At its annual meeting, sponsored by Cornerstone Bank and hosted by Emory University, Leadership DeKalb presented several graduates with outstanding alumni awards. Community leader and Decatur First Bank President Judy Turner '93 received the Leadership DeKalb 2009 Distinguished Alumni award for her role in launching the Decatur Book Festival in 2006. Thanks to Judy's leadership, the Decatur Book Festival held its sustainable and financially viable fourth festival on Labor Day weekend 2009.

Robert Soens '07, who received the 2008 Leadership DeKalb's Distinguished Alumni award and the 2009 Community Leadership award, was also present. Robert received his award for his role in redeveloping the historic Scottish Rite Hospital and founding the Martin Luther King Jr. service project, which assists seniors in Oakhurst with home projects. Since 2001, the project has grown to more than 700 volunteers. Soens is president of Pinnacle Custom Builders, Inc.

DeKalb County Superior Court Judge C.J. Becker '05 received the Leadership DeKalb 2009 Sue Ellen Owens award for meeting the community need to expand DeKalb's rehabilitative drug court and prevent defendants from sliding further into addiction and crime. Judge Becker took on the Drug Court expansion on top of a very full case load. She is also the incoming 2010-2011 president of Decatur Rotary.
